## Clive's Comments

I am not sure what it is like in other cities but this time of year really is Festival season. From mid February to early May there are so many events it is almost impossible to keep track of them all. They range over the full gamut of subjects from food to produce to fashion to cars. For us the main two are our Herb and Chilli Festival and the Melbourne International Food and Garden Festival. This year is tight with ours finishing on the Sunday night and MIFGS starting on the Wednesday.

Our event (HACF) is a big effort that takes all our focus for a month or two before. We are lucky as the festival is celebrating what we love in life; food, wine and music. Even so it is still a big job pulling it all together. We have been doing it for seven years now which means it is getting easier. The problem now is we don't stress so much and are always worried we will forget something obvious.

Like most paid events we get complaints about the price. Sometimes I wonder what people think (if they do) as we get complaints that at \$24 we are far too dear.

Comments like 'How dare we charge that amount?' get annoying. The costs are huge; security, insurance, permits, licenses, staff (before and on the day), rubbish removal, signage, advertising, stages, marquees, AV and the list goes on. Some events are free but these are usually run by either local council or volunteer groups. Not really free just hidden costs paid through rates, donations etc.

It is much the same with our plants that are not that much dearer than twenty years ago. There is continual pressure by big corporations to keep selling prices down and demand from the consumer to stay cheap. They have no idea what it costs to produce a plant (or much else for that matter) and how many inputs are...

required. This would be fine except they are also complaining because their wages aren't rising and they want less taxes and more social security. Better health and education, more money spent on sporting facilities, better roads and so on for all public expenditure.

I may not be very bright but even I can see that you cannot keep pushing up costs and yet expect prices to stay (or move) down. For the last few years the price pressures have been from government set expenses: wages, rates, taxes, power, water etc. Small businesses have been forced to squeeze margins to keep their prices down but this is becoming unsustainable.

The government is talking up tax cuts as an offset for wages growth. This means that the large profitable companies get some benefit whilst the smaller and struggling business get none or little. A small company turning over \$750,000 would have a wages bill around \$300,000 and if they are doing really well a profit of \$75,000. A 3% wage rise equals (allowing for super and work cover) \$25500 per annum whilst a 1% drop in tax on profits comes out at around \$750. I do not understand how any half intelligent person can say that a tax cut will fund a pay rise.

If government (all levels) really wants to improve the financial situation of working Australians (small employers included) then it should reduce the indirect taxes like rates, fuel excises, alcohol excises, levies on power companies, payroll taxes and stamp duties. They could also reduce compliance fees for licenses and permits and all the other charges they impose on us for just doing business. It seems skewed to me when small business generates most of the taxes but get the least benefits. I cannot see the government giving any nursery a share of \$100 million (ie Ford, GMH) to stop them closing up shop.

In our modern world we then have the added cost of theft and vandalism. If the culprits are caught and if they are charged and punished they are usually soon back on the street again and never have to pay for the damages. Yes much of it is covered by insurance but there is still the excess and then increase in premiums along with overall premium increases across the community. The system is running well for the large corporations, the large unions and the welfare sector. They pay minimal tax and are able to pass their costs on to someone else.

Anyway it is autumn, the heat is over and the rains will start soon (in southern Australia) which means it is good gardening time. Plants are growing and the public is buying. It is a good time of the year and we need to get plenty of stock on the ground for late autumn, winter and early spring sales. With the shift to indoor and patio plants it looks like the nursery industry may be in for a good year.

I hope autumn starts well and we get to see you at our Herb and Chilli Festival or at this year's Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show.
